Focus: Electric Vehicles & Energy Transition

November 2025

Budget 2025 Climate Overview

- Shift toward clean industrial policy and large-scale infrastructure.
- Emphasis on Clean Economy Investment Tax Credits (ITCs).
- Reductions in some federal program spending, including ECCC.

✓ Major Hits

Clean Electricity Investment Tax Credit

15% ITC for clean electricity generation and grid upgrades

Industrial Carbon Pricing

Strengthened federal benchmark with long-term price trajectory to 2050

Clean Electricity Expansion

- Nuclear, hydro, wind, solar, and energy storage investment
- Clean Electricity Regulations with provincial collaboration
- \$4.3B annually in clean energy investment linked to carbon pricing
- Focus: Make Canadian grid abundant and affordable

✓ Sustainable Finance Framework

- Made-in-Canada Sustainable Investment Guidelines (finalized by end 2026)
- Proposed Sustainable Bonds Framework for green & transition bonds
- Changes to anti-greenwashing provisions (we'll see where that goes)
- Climate-aligned disclosure rules for investors

✓ Additional Climate Investments

- \$6B over 10 years for climate adaptation & infrastructure (2026-27 start)
- \$372M over 2 years for biofuels production incentive
- Expanded Clean Technology Demonstration Initiative
- Strengthened methane regulations

⚠ Electric Vehicles: The Gap

Budget 2025 is notably QUIET on consumer EV support:

- No consumer purchase rebates mentioned
- No new charging infrastructure funding announced
- Existing iZEV rebate program unclear

Commercial EV Programs Ending

Medium & Heavy-Duty EV Rebates

Phasing out at end of 2025-2026

These supported commercial fleet electrification—critical for transport emissions

Transport Canada consolidating overlapping programs, but uncertain what replaces these initiatives

⚠ Key Misses

1. Consumer EV Support Silent

No clarity on personal vehicle purchase incentives or existing rebate continuance

2. Charging Infrastructure Unclear

No specific funding announced for EV charging network expansion

Additional Gaps

- Energy Efficiency Missing: No major productivity initiative for building retrofits
- Implementation Uncertainty: Many details deferred pending legislation
- Mixed Environmental Signals: New tax breaks for LNG facilities proposed alongside climate action,
 - cancellation of the 2 Billion Trees initiative

Key Takeaways

- Strong: Clean electricity & industrial pricing push competitiveness
- Weak: Consumer EV transition lacks explicit roadmap
- Opportunity: \$4.3B annual clean investment can transform grid
- **Challenge:** Implementation details critical to policy success







Ford Trucks unveils its first production-ready electric truck, the F-Line E

- Ford Trucks unveiled its first production-ready electric heavy truck, the F-Line E.
- It comes in two versions: a 6×2 (26-tonne) model with 390 kW peak power, and a 4×2 (19-tonne) variant with 290 kW.
- The truck uses an up to 392 kWh NMC battery (314 kWh usable), offering a range of up to 300 km (6×2) or 250 km (4×2), with DC fast-charging up to 285 kW.
- It'll be built in Turkey and will hit major European markets in 2026.

Hyundai to Expand US EV Plant

- Hyundai CEO José Muñoz said the company received a White House apology after the ICE raid at its Georgia battery plant.
- Despite the disruption, Hyundai is pushing ahead with a \$2.7 billion expansion at its Ellabell, GA, site to boost capacity by 200,000 vehicles per year.
- The automaker plans to build 10 electric and hybrid models at the site, up from just two currently.
- Hyundai's long-term goal: make 80% of U.S.-sold vehicles domestically by 2030, while growing global output to 5.6 million vehicles annually.

B.C. Drops 100% EV Target and Rules Out Return of Rebates

- British Columbia is scrapping its 100% zero-emission vehicle (ZEV) sales mandate for 2035, acknowledging that its previous targets (100% by 2035, 90% by 2030) are "no longer realistic."
- The provincial EV purchase rebate program has been ended, with the government indicating that any future incentives should come from Ottawa instead.
- To support EV uptake without rebates, B.C. will introduce a ZEV Affordability Program in 2026, rewarding automakers (not consumers) for lowering EV prices, offering low-interest financing, or expanding EV infrastructure.
- B.C. is also easing regulatory requirements by broadening which vehicles qualify for ZEV credits and relaxing electric-range minimums for plug-in hybrids especially to help buyers in rural and remote areas.

BEVs Up 20% YoY & PHEVs Down 10% YoY in China

- In October, China saw BEV (battery-electric vehicle) sales jump 20% year-over-year, reaching ~812,000 units, while PHEV (plug-in hybrid) sales fell 10% to ~470,000 units.
- BEVs now make up 36% of the total Chinese car market, helping drive overall plugin-vehicle growth.
- Despite the PHEV decline, total plugin (BEV + PHEV) sales remain near record peaks close to 1.3 million units in a month.
- The trend reflects a possible pivot point in China's EV market: strong growth for compact BEVs, but weakening demand for larger PHEVs and extended-range hybrids.

VW EVs Are Finally Getting Access To Tesla Superchargers

- VW, Audi, and Porsche EVs will gain Tesla Supercharger access on Nov 18 in the U.S. and Canada.
- Owners will get access to 25,000+
 Superchargers, a huge expansion beyond Electrify America's ~5,000 fast-charging sites.
- A \$200 adapter is required (rebated to \$100 for some 2025 owners; included on 2026 models).


